English	<p>GCSE English: We are currently using the Edexcel 9-1 English Language specification. Students learn to read and analyse 19th Century Fiction and 20th & 21st century literary non-fiction. They also study both transactional and imaginative writing. A spoken language assignment is also completed involving an oral presentation to an audience.</p> <p>Non-GCSE classes study towards Functional Skills Entry Level 1-3 in reading and writing and spoken language. They will complete a range of reading, writing and spoken language activities based on the following:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ Functional contexts: emails, notes, articles, leaflets & adverts. ➤ Fiction/non-fiction poetry, prose & drama texts ➤ Spoken language activities: presenting ideas to an audience, role-play/improvisation, and small-group discussions. <p>Some classes will also be completing AQA Unit Awards. The Dockside Reading Scheme is used where appropriate and all KS4 students have a reading book and complete a reading folder throughout the year.</p>		
Maths	<p>In Mathematics KS4 students will continue to develop their skills in Number, Measurement, Shape, Money and Data Handling. Whenever possible skills will be applied to real life situations. The students will prepare for Functional Skills Tests during Y11 at a level suitable to their skills.</p>		
Science	<p>Three-year OCR Entry Level (1-3) course and building on their enquiry skills through practical investigation. Topics: clean air, our electricity supply, attractive forces, pushes and pulls plus a two day event on CSI.</p>
